After her youngest daughter was in middle school, Lynne wanted to set an example for her daughters as a working mother and returned to work. She was an attendance officer for the Binghamton City School District where she served for over 20 years. Lynne loved her work and went above and beyond to help the children and families she served.

Her true passion was founding the College Connection with Betsy Williams. Lynne helped hundreds of students learn about colleges and helped many first generation students attend college. Lynne was a Board member and active in the BHS Dollars for Scholars as well as a trustee for the First Congregational Church in Binghamton for many years. Lynne expanded the Fresh Air Fund program to the Binghamton area. She became a gymnastic judge in the area. Lynne took over leadership and helped rejuvenate the Greater Binghamton Chapter of the Penn State Alumni Club. She also was a PSU alumni advisor for years, visiting high schools and hosting prospective students in her home.

Lynne loved whole family trips to Cape Cod, the beach, reading, Hilton Head, plants and flowers and watching PSU sports. Lynne's favorite times were when her family was together, no matter where they were.
