Victor Galecki, devoted husband of the late Kathy Galecki, loving father, grandfather, brother, and friend, passed away peacefully on May 25, 2026, at the age of 88, surrounded by the love of his family.

He was born on April 28, 1938, in Serock, Poland, to Emilia and Julian Galecki. Victor's early life was marked by hardship and perseverance. After losing his mother as a toddler, he endured a difficult childhood during the years of World War II.
